1. Key signature - the sharps or flats that are placed at the ~~beginning~~ beginning of a staff to indicate the key of the music
2. Time Signature - a symbol with 2 numbers that indicates the basic meter of a song. The upper indicates how many beats to a measure; the bottom indicates which note gets the beat.
3. Meter - The organization of beats and their division.
4. Tempo - the rate of speed at which beats are played in a song
5. Beat - any pulsing unit of musical time
6. Accidental - a marking used to raise or lower the indicated pitch
7. Notation - the art of writing musical notes on paper
8. Note - a symbol used to indicate the duration and pitch of a sound
9. Pitch - the highness/lowness of a tone
10. Score - the written depiction of all parts sung or played
11. Staff - lines and spaces that represent pitches
12. Measure - a group of beats indicated by

- μ bar line
13. Key - the relationship of tones with a common tonic
 14. Bar line - the vertical line placed on the staff between measures.
 15. Rhythm - the organization of sound and time
 16. Tonality - the organization of musical tones around a tonic
 17. Tonic - the first note of a scale
 18. Upbeat - The last beat of a measure as conducted
 19. Common time - $4/4$
 20. Syncopation - an accent on an ~~un~~ unexpected beat

4. A vertical line placed on the staff between measures.* Barline
5. The sharps or flats that are placed at the beginning of a staff to indicate where "DO" is.* Key signature
6. A symbol used to indicate the duration of pitch and duration of a sound.* note
7. The organization of of beats and their divisions.* Time signature
8. Five horizontal lines and four spaces where notes are placed.* Staff
